SUBJECT: A Resolution Authorizing the Governor to sign a Settlement Agreement with William Scotsman

WHEREAS: The Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes are a federally recognized Indian tribe organized pursuant to a Constitution approved by tribal membership on April 4, 2006 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior; and

WHEREAS: Article VI, Section 5(a) of the Constitution provides that Legislative power shall reside with the Legislature; and

WHEREAS: Article VI, Section 5(a) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the “power to make all laws and resolutions in accordance with the Constitution which are necessary and proper for the good of the Tribes;” and


WHEREAS: Article VI, Section 5(d) of the Constitution authorizes that the Legislature shall have the power to raise revenue and appropriate funds for expenditure; and

WHEREAS: Article V, Section VII, Section 4(d) provides that no contract shall be valid which has not been previously authorized by the Tribal Council or Legislature; and

WHEREAS: The Tribes have a balance owed to William Scotsman in the amount of \$99, 048.80 for previously leased trailers; and

WHEREAS: It is imperative that the Tribes pay off their balances in order to conduct good business and establish good working relationships with other businesses, organizations; etc.; and

NOW THEREFORE BE RESOLVED that The Cheyenne and Arapaho Ninth Legislature finds it necessary and proper for the good of the Tribes;" and hereby approves to appropriate the sum of \$99,048.80 to settle the dispute between the Tribes and William Scotsman for the previous use of trailers and the associated costs to return them from tax revenues and authorizes Governor Wassana to execute any and all documents necessary to carry out the intent of this resolution.



Pursuant to Article VI, Section 7, subsection (a)(iv) of the Tribes Constitution reads in part: "All laws shall take effect thirty (30) days after signature by the Governor or veto override by the Legislature, unless any Member of the Tribes submits to the Coordinator of the Office of Tribal Council a petition signed by at least one hundred fifty (150) Members of the Tribal Council seeking to repeal the law or resolution at the next Tribal Council meeting. If the Tribal Council fails to repeal such law or resolution at the next Tribal Council where the matter has been properly placed on the agenda for the Tribal Council meeting, such law or resolution shall become effective immediately."

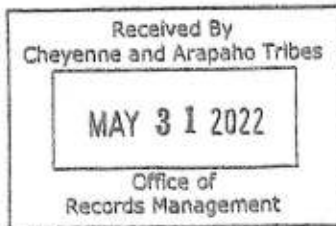
