SUBJECT: A Resolution Confirming the Supreme Court Justice nominated by Governor Reggie Wassana.

WHEREAS; The Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes are a federally recognized tribe with their own form of self-government organized under a constitution approved by Tribal membership on April 4, 2006, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior; and,

WHEREAS; Article VIII, Section 2 of the Constitution grants the power to the Legislature to confirm a Judge or Justice after nomination by the Governor, provided that if the Legislature fails to approve or disapprove a nominee within 30 days, then the nominee shall be deemed confirmed by the Legislature; and

WHEREAS: Art. VII Sec. 4(d) of the Constitution authorizes the Governor to negotiate contracts and sign contracts that have been approved by either the Legislature or the Tribal Council; and

WHEREAS: Governor Reggie Wassana on June 3, 2022 renominates Justice Lindsay Robertson for continuation to serve on the Supreme Court for another four (4) year term; and

WHEREAS: The Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes Ninth Legislature finds that the nominee is acceptable and believes an affirmative confirmation would solidify the authority of the Supreme Court.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ninth Legislature of the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes hereby confirms the Governor's nominee for Justice to the Supreme Court Lindsay Robertson.





Pursuant to Article VII, Section 4, subsection (g) of the Tribes Constitution reads: "The Governor shall have the power to sign any enactment passed by the Legislature into law or to veto any enactment passed by the Legislature within ten (10) days of passage with a written explanation of any objections; and if the Governor takes no action within ten (10) days, then the enactment shall become law in accordance with this Constitution."

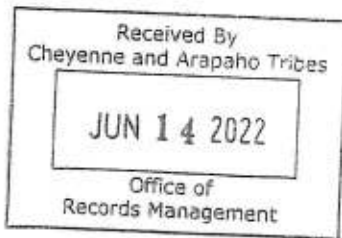
